| e. <u>Contact tracing</u> in combination with <u>isolation</u> and <u>quarantine</u> , in collaboration with the State and local health departments; | The school district will utilize a plan that keeps sick individuals at home. |
| f. <u>Diagnostic</u> and screening testing; | Families will be encouraged to employ daily pre-arrival screenings. |
| g. Efforts to provide <u>vaccinations to school communities</u> ; | The school district will partner with local providers to connect those requesting vaccination information. |
| h. Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and | Students with disabilities will receive their full list of accommodations. We will work closely with students, parents and physicians to make informed health-related decisions. |
| i. Coordination with state and local health officials. | Through the Schuylkill Intermediate Unit #29, the county superintendents will continue to meet regularly to discuss information from the state as well as our local emergency management contacts. |


